Reader's Letter

Dear friends.

Shortly before writing this letter, I had the honour to go to the funeral of Cllr Lloyd Wilce. Cllr Wilce will have been known by many in Cinderford and the surrounding area. It was a privilege to be able to serve on Cinderford Town Council alongside him as he was named "Britain's Longest Serving Councillor". Lloyd gave 69 years to public service as a councillor.



Many people gathered together at Lloyd's funeral; family, friends, fellow councillors and members of our community. As Linda gave the eulogy, there were happy memories and things to celebrate. Lloyd's long marriage, his son's, grandchildren, carnivals, fundraising, pram races, a pink pub and much more. But, as with most funerals, there was an undeniable sadness in church. Lloyd has passed away. We will not see him walking up the High Street, sitting in the Council Chamber or chatting in the garden. Adrian and Nigel have lost a father they were clearly very fond of. Many of us have lost a friend.

It is right that we mourn and take care of those who are grieving. Funerals are an important part of that process and I'd encourage people to think a little about their own funeral. It's not something we're keen to do. It's not normally a topic for the dinner table or the coffee shop. But I know it can be a lot easier for family members, if they know that their loved one has had their wishes included in their funeral service. If you don't feel able to talk about it, maybe write down your favourite hymns, music and memories and leave them with a copy of your will.

The past weeks have also been solemn as we've been in Lent, a time that starts with us being reminded of our own and Jesus' humanity on Ash Wednesday. Lent is a time when we reflect and repent, where we prepare for the death of Jesus, when there are often no flowers in church and this year the cold weather has seemingly added bleakness. But as Christians, this is not the end, funerals are not the end.

As Linda read at Lloyd's funeral and is often read at funerals, Jesus said, "I am the resurrection, and I am the life; those who believe in me, though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die" This month started with Easter and I presume a fabulous celebration, albeit we went to print before the main event! Easter is the most marvellous celebration of our year, for after Jesus' death, came his resurrection.

At Lloyd's funeral, Linda said "Lloyd loved and lived for Cinderford". And Jesus loves and lives for us. Because of Jesus, we have the hope of eternal life. The grave is not the end.

I spend a lot of time driving and enjoy listening to music whilst on my travels. Currently I'm hooked on the News Boys track 'God's not Dead'. The lyrics "God's not dead, He's surely alive. Let hope arise and make the darkness hide" are a brilliant anthem to blast out at this time of year. So now the solemn period of Lent has passed, let's celebrate the good news. Let's share the Easter truth. If you don't know the eternal hope that Easter gives us, talk to me or a member of our ministry team, we'd love to share it with you.

On Saturday 17 March, St Stephen's hosted its first Craft Fayre of 2018. 20 independent artisans brought a wide




variety of crafts including photography, knitting, sewing,




