Who's on the Trike?



Dear Friends.

My Dad wanted to live until he was 90.

My Granddad lived until he was 93, so I think my Dad thought that he would manage 90. Once he was in his 80s, he talked about this quite a bit. Sadly, he didn't make it. He would have been 90 on 5 October 2018, but he passed away a little over three years ago, on 27 September 2015, a week



and a day before his 87 birthday (5 October 2015). My Mum and I talked on the anniversary of his death, his birthday, and his funeral (7 October 2015). We shared memories of those specific days and memories of my Dad generally. They were good conversations recalling good memories.

The day before my Dad's funeral, my daughter Sarah, was in hospital giving birth to my granddaughter Heidi. After my Dad's funeral, and lots of sharing of conversations and memories afterwards, Sian and I headed off to visit Sarah and family and meet Heidi. My Mum gave me a little gift to take and give to my grandson Matty. She said to tell him it was from his Great-granddad. The very last time my Dad had been shopping, he had seen some toy cars and had bought them for Matty, but he had never had chance to give them to him. I took the cars and gave them to Matty, explaining that they were from Great-granddad. It was a powerful and poignant moment. Matty liked them, and was pleased, but he knew his Great-granddad had died and he was confused as to what to do. He did not know who to say 'thank you' to. How do you say 'thank you' to someone who has died?

100 years ago, 10 years before my Dad was born, the 'Great War' was coming to an end. Finally, after four years, three months, and two weeks, a ceasefire began at 11.00 am on 11 November 1918 following the signing of an armistice with Germany. Around sixteen million people (combatants and civilians) had died as a direct result of the war (with tens of millions more dying from genocides and the 1918 influenza pandemic that followed). Millions gave their lives trying to protect others. How should we respond? How do you say 'thank you' to someone who has died?

Sadly, the 'war to end all wars' did not live up to its name. The Second World War lasted from 1939 until 1945, and numerous other conflicts have followed and continue. Tens of millions lost their lives, again with millions sacrificing their lives to save others. Again, we struggle to know how to respond. How do you say 'thank you' to someone who has died?

If you would like to remember, and give thanks for, someone you have loved and lost, please join us at our All Souls service at St John's at 6.00pm on Sunday 4 November.

If you would like to remember, and give thanks for, those who gave their lives for us, please join us at one of our Remembrance services on Sunday 11 November (details inside).

There are plenty of opportunities to support in the coming month with the stall available whenever church is open but also at the Christmas Craft Fayre on Saturday 10 November and the stall will be on the move and joining with other Fairtrade church stalls at the Christmas Festival at Speech House on 17 & 18 November and St Ethelbert's Christmas Fayre on 24 November.

Traidcraft have released a further update to their situation, which contains more hopeful news, thanks to the support they have received from supporters around the country. Thanks for being part of that!

Traidcraft's CEO, Robin Roth, says, "We've received hundreds of messages of support from shareholders, Fair Traders, fair trade shops, staff, suppliers, and producers, and it's all contributed to this latest update.

It's the passion and drive of these communities which has


